This project is in the province of Eastern Cape and in the Mquma Local Municipal Area under the Amathole District Municipality jurisdiction.

Preferences are offered to prospective tenderers from the targeted area, namely the **Centane, Gcuwa and Nqamakwe** as well as the CIDB grades and classes indicated for each sub-contract package. This tender will be evaluated in terms of functionality as a criterion and the price and preference points system.

Tenderers must be represented at the information briefing meeting by a representative who must be the tenderer himself or an authorised person in the direct employment of the tenderer. Late arrivals to the compulsory information briefing meeting will not be allowed access, and therefore will not be allowed to submit a tender. Such tenders received, shall be deemed non-responsive.

Notes to Prospective Bidders: Compulsory submissions (Failure to submit any of the following will result in disqualification):

All bids submitted should remain valid for a period of **90 days** after the bid closing date.

- Certified copies of business registration documents, as issued by CIPC;
- Certified copies of identity documents of **directors/shareholders/partners/members** as the case may be;
- Municipal clearance certificate certifying that no municipal rates and service charges owed by the bidder and any of its directors to Amathole District Municipality or to any other municipality where the bidder's business operations are located are in arrears for more than three months. If you don't pay rates you must submit both affidavit from the commissioner of oath and Letter from Ward Councillor, if you submit **one** of the two you will be **disqualified**;
- Original or certified copy of B-BBEE certificate Level 1 or Sworn Affidavit, **Failure to submit will result in zero points score for BBBEE status level**;
- Exempted Micro Enterprise (EME) or Qualifying Small Enterprise (QSE);

- f) Registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD);
- g) Valid SARS Tax Pin Confirmation Compliant;
- h) Registered as “**active**” with the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) in the relevant contractor grade and class designation and with a status as potentially emerging (PE);

- j) Bidders are required to submit at least one key personnel with the minimum NQF Level 4 LIC, their CV's and Qualifications;
- k) **All bidders should complete MBD 1, MBD 4, MBD 8, MBD 9**

Failure to supply all required and supplementary information will result in the tender being deemed non-responsive and therefore, the tender will not be considered for award.

- a) The Employer will reserve the right to negotiate feasible rates with the preferred tenderers if necessary.
- b) The lowest or any proposal will not necessarily be accepted, and the Employer reserves the right to accept or not to accept any proposal either in whole or in part and any assistance in completing partly or full the proposal from Employer's Officials will result in disqualification of bid.

 - a. The Schedule comprises items covering the Consortium's profit and costs of general liabilities and of the construction of temporary and permanent Works.

Although the Tenderer is at liberty to insert a rate of his own choosing for each item in the Schedule, his attention is drawn to the fact that the tenderer has the right, under various circumstances, to payment for additional works carried out and that the Client is obliged to base his assessment of the payment to be paid for such additional work on the rates inserted in the Schedule by the tenderer.
 - c. Clause 8 of each Standardized Specification and the measurement and payment clause of each Particular Specification, read together with the relevant clause of the Project Specification, set out what ancillary or associated activities are included in the rate for the operations specified.
3. Descriptions in the Schedule of Quantities are abbreviated. The schedule has been drawn up generally in accordance with the latest issue of "Civil Engineering Quantities". Should any requirement of the measurement and payment clause of the applicable Standardized Specification, or the Project Specification, or the Particular Specification(s) conflict with the terms of the Schedule or, when relevant "Civil Engineering Quantities", the requirement of the Standardized, Project or Particular Specification, as applicable, shall prevail.
